It is my pleasure to share some exciting updates about **Northeastern** University's Africa Global Initiative (AGI). In our first newsletter from June 2021, we spoke of our commitment to increase African student enrollment at Northeastern and leverage existing and new partnerships with academic institutions, alumni, and employers. This fall, graduate student enrollment from Africa rose by 38 percent with the

strongest cohorts coming from Nigeria, Ghana, Egypt, Kenya, and Uganda. Northeastern's Enrollment Management team participated in more than 20 graduate virtual fairs on the continent, and developed new relationships with African institutions and channel partners along the way. Further, Enrollment Management and the colleges have partnered with

University Advancement and Alumni Relations to launch the **African Students** Access Scholarship. The fund offers partial and full scholarships to graduate students from Africa as part of the regular admissions process. We are committed to assisting student-led initiatives to ensure that all African students feel situated at Northeastern, their home away from home during their




